Monday	Lessons (9.00am - 12.30pm)	Valletta Tour (13.00pm – 17.00pm)	Valletta, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, is an old city steeped in rich history. Built by the Knights of St. John as their capital Valletta was walled after the Great Siege of Malta in 1565.
Tuesday	Lessons (9.00am - 12.30pm)	Harbour Cruise (12.45pm – 16.00pm)	This Cruise will take you around the two harbours on either side of Valletta – Marsamxett and the Grand Harbour. A detailed commentary will unfold the history of Valletta and the Three Cities connected with the two Great Sieges of 1565 and 1942, and point out all the other places of interest which can only be admired from the sea.
Wednesday	Lessons (9.00am - 12.30pm)	Mdina Special Tour (13.50pm – 16.00pm)	Mdina also known as "The Silent City" is the medieval old capital city. Previously inhabited by the Phoenicians, Arabs, Normans, Romans and later on by the Knights. A visit to the Mosta Dome, which is renowned as the 3rd largest Dome in Europe, is also included.
Thursday	Lessons (9.00am - 12.30pm)	St. John's Co-Cathedral & Malta Experience (13.00pm – 16.00pm)	St. John's Cathedral was built by the Knights in 1577. Its marble floor is covered with the coats of arms of the various knights. Here one can view the priceless painting by Caravaggio – "The Beheading of St. John"
Friday	Lessons (9.00am - 12.30pm)	Wine Tasting Tour (12.45pm – 16.00pm)	This tour, takes place in the Marsovin Cellars in Marsa. It commences with a historical introduction amongst original artefacts, followed by an explanation about the process of how locally grown grapes are pressed, fermented and eventually made into wine. Afterwards you can sample the different local wines.
Saturday		Gozo Tour (07.45am – 18.00pm)	A wonderful opportunity to spend the day on Gozo, the sister island of Malta, where you will visit the Citadel situated in Victoria, the capital city of Gozo. You will also visit Xlendi bay which is a picturesque fishing village, Ggantija temples which are renowned for their freestanding megalithic structure (entrance optional), Ta' Pinu Church, and the Azure window.

Monday	Lessons (9.00am - 12.30pm)	Tarxien Temples & Ghar Dalam (10.00am – 13.00pm)	The copper age temples are amongst the most ancient religious sites on Earth and are described by the World Heritage Sites committee as "unique architectural masterpieces."
Tuesday	Lessons (9.00am - 12.30pm)	Blue Grotto (14.30pm – 17.00pm)	This natural picturesque grotto and its neighbouring system of caverns mirrors the brilliant phosphorescent colours of the underwater flora. The Blue Grotto is located near "Wied iz-Zurrieq". The scenery around this area of the island is breathtaking.
Wednesday	Lessons (9.00am - 12.30pm)	Three Cities Tour (13.00pm – 17.00pm)	The Three Cities offer an intriguing insight into Malta and its history. Left largely unvisited, these cities are a slice of authentic life as well as a glimpse into Malta's maritime fortunes.
Thursday	Lessons (9.00am - 12.30pm)	Fort Rinella Tour (13.00pm – 16.00pm)	Fort Rinella is Malta's liveliest museum where history comes to life daily. Built in 1878, this fort is not only a unique remnant of Malta's recent British colonial past but it was also the world's first mechanical fort which enabled its small garrison to fire a monstrous 100-ton gun every six minutes.
Friday	Lessons (9.00am - 12.30pm)	Farewell Dinner (19.00pm – 23.00pm)	farewell dinner will be served in a typical Maltese restaurant.
