Course Content and Strategies

The Methodology classes focus on the main teaching methodologies and techniques. Participants have the opportunity to create a wide range of lessons by using different kinds of input material such as: literary texts, newspaper, songs, movies.

Teaching techniques for improving reading, writing, speaking skills are also covered, as well as error correction strategies.

Class observation completes the theory of the course. Participants can observe different language levels and see how the previously analysed material is used in class.

Some activities (Salerno city tour and cultural seminars) are included. Excursions and visits with tasting can be booked at extra cost. *The schedule may be subject to change.*

Methodology

The methodology classes will focus on:

- An overview on Language Teaching Approaches
- Course materials: how to choose and evaluate teaching materials
- Teaching techniques to develop oral production
- Teaching Units: how to create a teaching unit by using movies
- How to use songs and games to develop the speaking
- Teaching Units: how to create a teaching unit by using a literary text
- Breaking ice activities for the first lesson
- Evaluation: How to evaluate and be evaluated reducing the affective filter

Class Observation

- Class observation different language levels
- Cultural seminar observation: i.e. seminar on Italian gestures, Italian cooking, etc.

- Improved their confidence in teaching Italian FL
 - Developed a greater awareness of the Italian culture and history

 - Developed a wider awareness of teaching techniques to develop oral production

 - Developed a better understanding of students' needs
 - Practiced teamwork activities thus enhancing their interpersonal skills
